Help Give Children the Tools They Need to Achieve

Our Story

Achieve in Africa was created in September 2008 after witnessing the distressed state of schools in Shinyanga and Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania. On the initial trip in 2007, one of our founders raised money for schools lacking basic supplies such as pens, paper, and books.

He was inspired by the enthusiasm the students had for learning, despite their lack of resources. This experience fueled a desire to better equip these and similarly disadvantaged children with the school supplies and facilities to choose their own path in life.

AIA provides the resources needed for children in Africa to make the full use of their education. We strive to give these children the building blocks they need to succeed for the rest of their lives.



The Need

In Tanzania, the government creates the curriculum and pays teachers while the community is responsible for the maintenance of the school.



In the village of Olasiti, the **average yearly income per family is between only \$90 and \$100**. Olasiti Primary School has over 1900 students and desperately needs two additional classrooms. The villagers of Olasiti sorely lack the resources to pay for these classrooms.

Our Mission

AIA strives to provide the children of Africa with a structured learning environment by rebuilding and aiding schools in need of reconstruction and supplies.

We believe that education attacks the root causes of poverty in under-developed countries.

Through education, we hope to give these children the **opportunity to reach their full potential, lead better lives, and inspire future generations.**



Current Project

AIA's first project will be Olasiti Primary School in Tanzania. Even with 16 functional classrooms, the school struggles to accommodate its 1,922 students. Classrooms are currently overcrowded, causing some students to stand during class.



AIA make plans for construction in June, when one of our founders will travel to Tanzania. AIA is raising \$30,000 USD for two additional classrooms for the Olasiti Primary School.
